



Accomplishments 2018-2019

- Served 5541 youth
- 2402 mentors provided approximately 125,000 hours of service; worth an estimated value of \$3,086,250 (over 3 million dollars!)
- MENTOR Rhode Island supported a statewide network of 66 mentoring programs serving 32 Rhode Island cities and towns.
- Overcame a \$100,000 funding cut in Warwick while maintaining services for 101 mentoring pairs.
- MENTOR Rhode Island coordinated school-based mentoring programs in Warwick, Woonsocket, Cranston, Pawtucket, Newport/Middletown, Warren & Providence serving 300 students. The vast majority of program participants (mentors, mentees, parents, and teachers) report high satisfaction levels with the program as well as improved academic and social indicators for mentees.
- MENTOR Rhode Island maintained and expanded key relationships with the business community including Amica, HarborOne Bank, CVS, Fidelity Investments, Textron, and more.
- 836 people, representing 51 organizations, attended 48 total trainings including: Program Coordinator training, Mentor training, mentor roundtable, Everyday Mentor Training and topical trainings including; Trauma Informed Mentoring, Gender Identity, & Advocating for your Mentee.
- Worked with 6 network programs through the National Quality Mentoring System (NQMS). This process provides network programs with a continuous vehicle for assessment, improvement and innovation.
- Continued serving as Rhode Island's only technical assistance provider for the National Mentoring Resource Center. Providing more than \$30,000 worth of free technical assistance to 14 mentoring programs.
- Provided Everyday Mentor Trainings to several schools, organizations, and clubs who regularly interact with children. The training prepares adults who have informal mentoring relationships with youth better understand their role as mentor and the skills necessary to act more intentionally in that role.
- Amgen STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics) Grant supported MENTOR Rhode Island's work in various STEM related mentoring initiatives including Million Women Mentors RI & Brown STEMS (students from Brown University serving as tutors to students at Providence's Hope High School).
- Designed and Launched a new Annual Fundraising Campaign.
- Held the 8th annual Frozen Clam Dip on New Year's Day raising \$12,500 for MENTOR Rhode Island.
- Held the 13th anniversary Dancing with the Stars of Mentoring Fun'raiser. The event drew more than 600 guests and netted MENTOR Rhode Island \$126,000.
